



Who is The Brotherhood of St. Andrew?

Founded in 1883, we were named for the Apostle Andrew, the first to be called by Jesus. Each time Andrew is mentioned in the New Testament, he is introducing someone to Jesus. We were incorporated by an Act of the U. S. Congress, signed by President Theodore Roosevelt, on May 30, 1908. That Act states in part, "...the sole object of said corporation shall be the spread of Christ's Kingdom among men." The Episcopal Church has recognized us as "the men's ministry of the Episcopal Church".

Our chapter, originally chartered in 1912, follows the same foundational disciplines as do other chapters worldwide: Prayer, Study and Service. In fact, our meetings have 20 minutes of prayer for each other and others in our lives, 20 minutes of study of a Gospel passage, and 20 minutes to discuss what we can do in our church and community. We typically meet alternately for dinner on a Tuesday evening and breakfast on a Saturday morning with two meetings a month.
